 24/7 from a computer, laptop, tablet, or smart phone

Accessing the Online Library

- You can access Online Library resources from the Summon search results, or from your programme gateway.
- Each programme has a dedicated Online Library gateway which contains a list of resources that are relevant to your course.
- You can find it by going to the library home page, clicking on 'Study programme' at the top, and selecting your programme.

 ABI/INFORM Global: a multi-disciplinary database covering business, management, economics and a wide range of related fields.





EBSCO

- The Online Library subscribes to several databases from the publisher EBSCO, including:
- Academic Search Complete, a social sciences multi-disciplinary database with full-text coverage of almost 4,700 scholarly publications.
- And Business Source Premier, which has full text coverage of over 2,100 business publications





VLeBooks (Browns)

- VLeBooks is the Online Library's principal e-book platform
- VLeBooks currently has over 2,200 titles. The collection is constantly growing and covers a range of subjects.
