E-books in a Nutshell

Did you know that the Online Library databases contain a growing collection of e-books which you may find useful for your further reading? It is advisable that you ensure you have all the required essential readings. If a book that is referred to heavily in your study guide is not available, you should consider purchasing a copy. However, you may first wish to check your local libraries for availability. <u>WorldCat</u> searches worldwide library catalogues to help you locate items in libraries near you.

Summon

The best way to search for e-books in the Online Library is to use Summon, the search engine on the Online Library homepage. You can limit your results to e-books by clicking on **Book/eBook** on the left side of the search results page.

You can find almost all of our e-books using Summon. However, for some you will need to log directly into the database from your <u>programme gateway</u> and then search or browse the collection. The rest of this Nutshell guide provides an overview of the e-books available from the Online Library databases.

VLeBooks

<u>VLeBooks</u> is the Online Library's principal e-book collection. At the time of writing, we have over 2,000 e-books in this collection, and the collection is constantly growing.

You can access VLeBooks from your programme gateway. You can also find books in VLeBooks using Summon search. Please note that VLeBooks is separate from your Virtual Learning Environment.

You can read most books in VLeBooks whenever you need to. However, for some books, the publisher allows only one user to read a copy of the book at a time. Like a physical library, you may need to wait before you can read the book if all copies are in use. If this happens, you can join a queue and you will be notified when it is your turn to read the book.

You can read books in your internet browser, or you can download a book for a limited time using free software called Adobe Digital Editions. The <u>How can I download e-books? page</u> has more information.

E-Book Central (ProQuest)

The Online Library also provides access to a growing collection of e-books in <u>E-Book Central</u>. You can find the e-books using Summon search, and you can also login from your programme gateway.

You can read most books in E-Book Central whenever you need to. However, for some books, the publisher allows only one user to read a copy of the book at a time. Like a physical library, you may need to wait before you can read the book if all copies are in use. If this happens, E-Book Central will tell you when the book is likely to be available and you can try again later.

You can read books in your internet browser, or you can <u>download books</u> for a limited time using some free software called Adobe Digital Editions. You can also download a limited number of individual chapters from each book to read with Adobe Reader.

ABI/Inform Global (ProQuest)

The Online Library also has some books in ABI/Inform Global. You can find them using Summon, or log directly into the database from the ABI/Inform Global database page.

Once you have logged in, click on the **Advanced Search** tab. Then under **Source** type, select **Books**.

EBSCO Databases

There are e-books in 3 databases hosted by EBSCO:

EBSCO eBook Collection

Log into the database. You can then search the collection, or to browse the collection click the **eBooks** link in the top toolbar. Please note that only one person at a time can consult an e-book in this database.



Academic Search Complete (EBSCO)

Books in this database can be found through Summon search. To browse, login from your programme gateway, or from the <u>Academic Search Complete database page</u>.

Access the eBooks by selecting **Advanced search**, and then searching by the publication type **Book**.

Business Source Premier (EBSCO)

Login from your programme gateway, or from the <u>Business Source Premier database page</u>. Access the eBooks by selecting **Advanced search**, and then searching by the publication type **Book**.

Literature Online (LION)

This database contains many classic literary works, such as *Jane Eyre* by Charlotte Brontë and *Paradise Lost* by John Milton. You can login from the <u>Literature Online database page</u>.

JSTOR

More than 5,800 open access ebooks are available on JSTOR. You can find and read them in <u>JSTOR's open access pages</u>.

Google Books

<u>Google Books</u> has full text access to out-of-print books and full text extracts of a wide range of in print books. Limited preview versions exclude some pages due to copyright law.

Project Gutenberg

<u>Project Gutenberg</u> is the Internet's oldest producer of free electronic books. It currently holds over 60,000 books.
