

## E-Books in a Nutshell

Did you know that the Online Library databases contain a growing collection of e-books which you may find useful for your further reading? It is advisable that you ensure you have all the required essential readings. If a book that is referred to heavily in your study guide is not available, you should consider purchasing a copy. However, you may first wish to check your local libraries for availability. Worldcat searches worldwide library catalogues to help you locate items in libraries near you;

### Summon

The best way to search for e-books in the Online Library is to use Summon, the search engine on the Online Library homepage. You can limit your results to e-books by clicking on **Book/eBook** on the left side of the search results page.



You can find almost all of our e-books using Summon. However, for some you will need to log directly into the database and then search or browse the collection. The rest of this Nutshell guide provides an overview of the e-books available from the Online Library databases.

### Dawsons E-Book Collection

The Dawsons E-book Collection is the Online Library's principal e-book collection. At the time of writing, we have over 900 e-books in this collection, and the collection is constantly growing.



## ABI/Inform Global (ProQuest)

The Online Library also has some books in ProQuest. You can find them using Summon, or log directly into the database from this page:

Once you have logged in, click on the **Advanced Search** tab. Then under **Source type**, select **Books**.



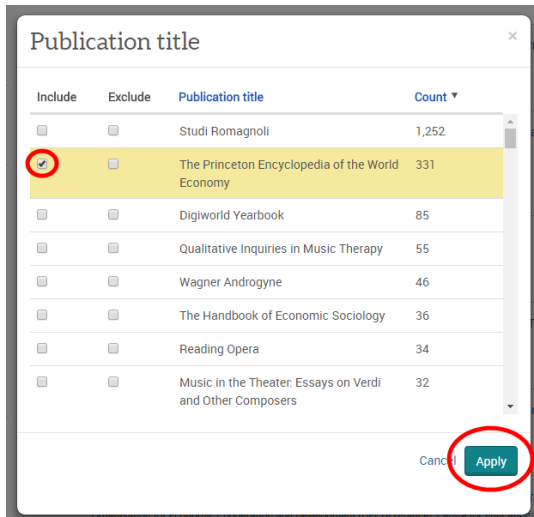
Click **Search**, and then on the search results page scroll down to **Publication title** on the left side of the page. Expand it and click on **More options**.

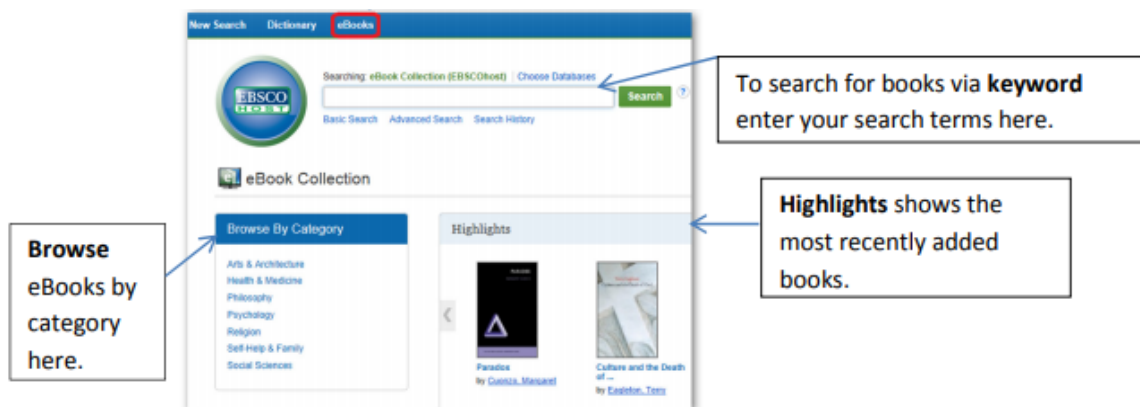

## EBSCO Databases

There are ebooks in 3 databases hosted by EBSCO:

### EBSCO eBook Collection

Login at <http://search.ebscohost.com>, then select **EBSCO host web** at the top of the list of databases, and then choose **eBook Collection** from the list. You can then search the collection, or to browse the collection click the **eBooks** link in the top toolbar.



Please note that only one person at a time can consult an e-book in this database.

## Academic Search Complete (EBSCO)

Books in this database can be found through Summon search. To browse, login from your programme gateway, or from this database page:
