



Quick Start Guide- Australian Education Index

Bibliographic database covering current literature relevant to Australian education including articles, conference papers, and reports by Australian authors or about Australian education published in overseas sources. Has links to the full text of documents where these are available online. Coverage from 1976 onwards.

This guide is intended to help you start searching the database and to save, print or email articles you find.

Once you have logged in from the Online Library website (<http://onlinelibrary.london.ac.uk/resources/databases/australian-education-index>), go down to Australian Education Index near the bottom of the list.

Searching

There are Basic and Advanced Search options. Take a few moments to have a look at these different screens, and see which works best for you and the research you are doing.

If you know the details of the article you want you can type the title into the basic search box putting quotation marks around the text. Or you can search for articles on a topic, e.g. "Total quality management"



Using quotation marks searches for the exact phrase within the document. "Total quality management" is therefore a more precise search than for total quality management, which would retrieve articles with the words present individually.

Advanced Search

You can construct a more precise search by clicking **Advanced Search** above the search box. Advanced Search allows you to narrow or expand your search results more easily.

If want a more precise search, you can narrow your results in a number of ways, including by journal name, subject and type of resource. Click on a bar to narrow your search to that year, or enter a specific date range

Click on 'Preview' to see an abstract and to email, print, cite or save that article

Click the title to see the full text and to see more details on the article

You can change the order of results in the list

Select articles using the square check boxes, then click cite, email or print

If you want to refine your search more, you can search within your search results by clicking **Search within** underneath the search box or at the bottom of the page.

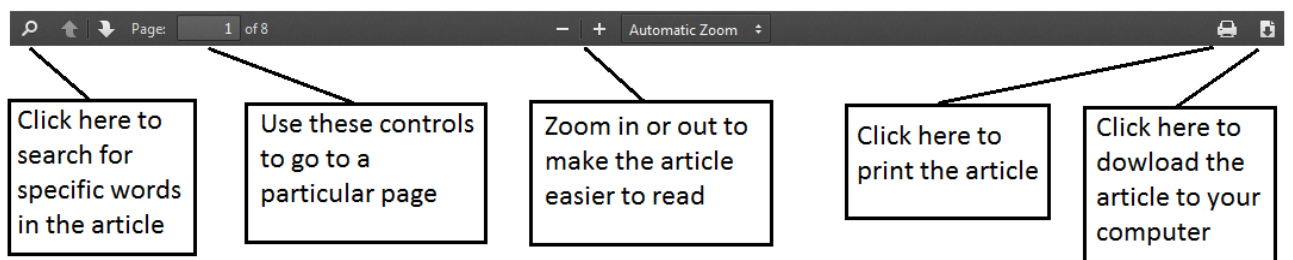
If you click on the title of the resource, you will be taken to a screen with all the details related to the resource. For many of them, there will be a link to the PDF under the abstract.
