



Quick Start Guide- Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC)

The Education Resources Information Center (ERIC) is an online digital library of education research and information.

ERIC is sponsored by the Institute of Education Sciences of the United States Department of Education.

The mission of ERIC is to provide a comprehensive, easy-to-use, searchable, Internet-based bibliographic and full-text database of education research and information for educators, researchers, and the general public.

This guide will provide further understanding of the library, the material included and how to search for it.

Searching

You can either search the Collection or the Thesaurus.

- Your search terms will cover all the key ERIC fields: title, author, source, abstract and descriptor.
- A search by ISBN, ISSN or IES Grant/Contract Number can also be entered directly into the search box.
- Use quotes to group words into specific phrases.
- Use AND/OR to limit the search, with parentheses if required.
- You can exclude search terms (e.g. Sports – football).

Purpose and Scope

The ERIC Thesaurus is a list of terms representing research topics in the field of education. Descriptors from the ERIC Thesaurus are assigned to every document in the ERIC digital library to describe its subject content.

The ERIC Thesaurus contains a total of 11,721 terms. There are 4,520 Descriptors and 7,068 Synonyms. There are also 133 Dead terms which are no longer used as Descriptors but remain in the Thesaurus to aid in searching older records. The ERIC Thesaurus was last updated in October 2015. 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Development an Instrument to Measure University Students' Attitude towards E-Learning

The study of student's attitude towards e-learning can in many ways help managers better prepare in light of e-learning for the future. This article describes the process of the development of an instrument to measure university students' attitude towards e-learning. The scale was administered to 200 University students from two countries (India and Iran). The 83-item attitude towards e-learning scale was developed on six domains as Perceived usefulness; Intention to adopt e-learning; Ease of e-learning use; Technical and pedagogical support; E-learning stressors; Pressure to use e-learning.
