Database Passwords: Student Portal Password

The Online Library databases are password protected.

The **Student Portal username and password** is required to access the Online Library databases:

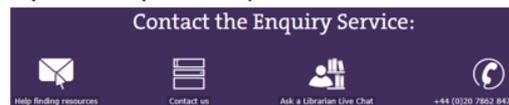
